Discipline Summary

Dr. Ryan Kirschner 50 Marketplace Avenue, #11 Ottawa, Ontario

Hearing Date: February 7, 2020

Allegations of professional misconduct

- Contravened the standards of practice in relation to inducing general anesthesia or conscious sedation
- Disgraceful, dishonourable, unprofessional or unethical conduct
- Treated without consent

Synopsis

- This matter arose as the result of a patient complaint about Dr. Kirschner's sedation and informed consent protocols. The patient was prescribed Triazolam as an oral sedative, but had understood that she would be receiving Ativan.
- Dr. Kirschner admitted that he failed to meet the standard of practice relating to sedation by:performing inadequate root canal therapies and inadequate restorative
- treatments for these two patients;
 - Prescribing oral sedation medication that resulted in moderate sedation, for which he did not have authorization;
 - Failing to follow the clinical monitoring processes for moderate sedation;
 - Failing to ensure that the patient was oriented, ambulatory, had stable vital signs, and showed increased alertness prior to discharging her;
 - Failing to advise the patient of pre- and post-operative instructions
- Dr. Kirschner admitted that he failed to obtain the patient's informed consent by:
 - Failing to discuss the types of oral sedation available or their associated risks;
 - Completing the crown procedure without discussing the procedure and oral sedation with the patient in advance of her taking the oral sedation;

- Permitting the patient to sign a consent document after she had taken the oral sedative;
- Treating the patient for a therapeutic purpose, without consent, in a situation in which consent was required.
- Dr. Kirschner admitted that he relied upon an American reference text about sedation that does not reflect the College's sedation standard.

Decision

1. Finding

Dr. Kirschner pleaded guilty and was found guilty with respect to the above allegations of professional misconduct.

2. Penalty

- Reprimand
- Suspension of certificate of registration for one month (February 8 - March 7, 2020)
- Dr. Kirschner prohibited from administering any form of sedation, except minimal sedation using nitrous oxide, specifically, nitrous oxide and oxygen sedation
- Course on Informed Consent
- Course on Recordkeeping
- Practice to be monitored for 24 months following completion of courses

3. Costs

• Dr. Kirschner to pay costs to the College in the amount of \$2,500

Panel's reasoning

- The penalty was reached as the result of a joint submission, and was appropriate in the circumstances of this case.
- This was Dr. Kirschner's first time before the Discipline Committee and he has no prior record of complaints.
- Dr. Kirschner was regretful and cooperative with the College.
- Dr. Kirschner volunteered to only provide nitrous oxide minimal sedation going forward. This demonstrated a willingness to learn from these circumstances and ensure that the public was protected.
- The publication of this decision will act as a general deterrent to all Ontario dentists.
- The reprimand and one-month suspension of Dr. Kirschner's certificate of registration (licence) will act as a specific deterrent that conduct of this nature will not be tolerated.
- Dr. Kirschner took a one-day anesthesia course on his own initiative. The courses in recordkeeping and informed consent, and practice monitoring, will contribute to his rehabilitation.
- The penalty will maintain public confidence in the profession and serve to protect the public.
